Daily Routine – We will have a more relaxed timetable than that in
main school and our days won't look exactly the same every day.

However, this is an example of what a typical day might look like...

8:40am to 9:00am – Arrive and Settle

9:00am to 9:20am – Breakfast

9:20am to 10:00am – Individual Learning Time

10:00am to 10:20am – Gross Motor Skills/Sensory Circuits

10:20am to 11:00am – Individual Learning Time

11:00am to 11:30am – Breaktime

11:30am to 11:45am – Fine Motor Skills

11:45am to 12:15pm – Individual Target Time

12:15pm to 1:30pm – Lunchtime

1:30pm to 2:30pm – Individual Learning Time

2:30pm to 3:00pm – Assembly or Story Time

3:00pm to 3:20pm – End of Day and Going Home



First Week in September – Building work is not due to complete until the end of August, so in order for us to set up the SHIP ready for children we will not be opening full time until Monday 9th September.

However, we have some transition plans in place for the week before.

They look like this...

Monday 2 nd September	Staff Training Day – School Closed to Children
Tuesday 3 rd September	Staff Training Day – School Closed to Children
Wednesday 4 th September	Home visits – Miss Hewitt and another SHIP adult will come visit you at home. *
Thursday 5 th September	Children to visit SHIP individually with parents/carers *
Friday 6 th September	Whole group transition without parents/carers - 9:30am – 10:30am *

Other things –

Lunch – Children can bring a packed lunch from home or they can order a school lunch. They will have the choice of eating either quietly in the SHIP or eating in the school lunch hall.



Slippers - We are hoping to make the SHIP feel more like a home than a classroom so we would love it if children could bring in pair of slippers or similar to wear as their indoor shoes.

School Uniform – As the SHIP is an extension of Falcon Junior School, we would encourage children to wear our school uniform. However, we also recognise that some of our SHIP children might have different sensory needs so if we need to make amendments to their uniform, then that's something we can do.



Stationery – Children are more than welcome to bring in their own pencil case with their own stationery, however everything they need will also be provided so this is not a requirement.
