Lack of social distancing in the classroom resulting in direct transmission of the virus	Pupils and staff	<ol> <li>Children to be in class bubbles of approximately 30 children.</li> <li>Children keep to their desks when in the room. Desks must be set out forward facing in rows.</li> <li>Social distancing charter created for and with the children –         <ul> <li>(Include instructions how to line up, use of toilet, moving around the classroom etc)</li> </ul> </li> <li>Charter re-visited and modelled many times a day and linked to school behaviour system – lots of praise for adherence and sanctions for non-compliance</li> <li>Children isolated if cannot adhere to charter and spoken to re the need for social distancing. This is all staff's responsibility.</li> <li>Lessons planned for individual work (not pairings or group work)</li> <li>Feedback – using large whiteboard and interactive whiteboard not close interaction</li> <li>Teacher to teach from the front. Any close work with child is to be side on.</li> <li>Children to use same desk if returning next day</li> <li>Teachers and TAs are assigned to these children and stay with these children throughout the day (and on subsequent days)</li> <li>Children stay in the classroom for majority of the day and not mix with other groups</li> <li>Year 3, 4 and 5 cloakrooms in classrooms. Year 6 use corridor but with staggered break/lunch. Lunch trollies used.</li> </ol>
Lack of social distancing using toilets and poor hygiene resulting in direct and indirect transmission of the virus	Pupils and staff	<ol> <li>Toilet signing board used (Initials)/pegs and only one child allowed to go to toilet at a time during lesson time.</li> <li>Invirtu Hand Sanitiser used after toilet use as well as washing hands.</li> <li>Extra Signs in toilet re washing hands.</li> <li>Sinks in classroom for additional hand washing.</li> <li>Toilet door handles regularly sanitised with Milton.</li> <li>All toilets cleaned regularly.</li> <li>Extra soap ordered to ensure we do not run out.</li> <li>Hand sanitiser available in all classrooms.</li> </ol>
Lack of social distancing waiting to enter classroom in morning resulting in direct transmission of the virus	Pupils and staff	<ol> <li>Markers on playground for the children to wait on, teachers to be outside to show children where to line up.</li> <li>Keep left system in place</li> <li>Allocated gate for parents to arrive and and leave from. Year 3 and 5 and Year 4 and 6.</li> <li>Instructions shared re social distancing between families in the morning with parents and children</li> <li>Signage for parents and children displayed outside the classroom</li> <li>HT and staff to be on duty to supervise</li> <li>Staggered drop off and pick up times</li> </ol>
Lack of social distancing during playtimes and lunchtimes	Pupils	<ol> <li>Staggered playtimes and allocated play areas</li> <li>Reduced playtime equipment – hard surfaces and can be easily cleaned</li> <li>Milton available to sterilise</li> <li>Games discussed which encourage social distancing – football passing, catch etc</li> <li>Staff supervision throughout – actively encouraging and</li> </ol>

Lack of social distancing when eating lunch resulting in direct transmission of the virus	Pupils	<ol> <li>Children eat in their classrooms.</li> <li>Children asked to bring packed lunch.</li> <li>Staggered lunchtimes and play.</li> </ol>
Lack of social distancing in the corridors resulting in direct transmission of the virus	Pupils and staff	<ol> <li>Children staying in their classroom and accessing outside via designated exit door.</li> <li>One child going to toilet at one time</li> <li>Keep left system around the school using walkway and outside – safety concerns</li> <li>Agree instructions with children concerning going and returning to toilet</li> <li>When moving class around the school – walking, calm and low volume – regular practice this in the first few days</li> </ol>
Contact of shared resources resulting in indirect transmission of the virus	Pupils	<ol> <li>days</li> <li>Children provided with stationery packs by the school/children bring own stationery not to shared.</li> <li>Tubs of resources for individuals if needed – maths cubes etc</li> <li>Resources washed in Milton each night and left to dry if not same person using them the next day</li> <li>Tables, door handles and other surfaces cleaned with detergent every night</li> <li>Lessons planned so resources are individual and not shared – or on white board</li> <li>Resources on tables ready for lesson and not distributed within the lesson</li> <li>Plastic packets (zippy) bags used for individual resources</li> <li>Children encouraged to wash hands / use hand sanitiser bafore lagoons and after each lagoon</li> </ol>
Contact of shared play equipment resulting in indirect transmission of the virus	Pupils	<ol> <li>before lessons and after each lesson</li> <li>Box of equipment available for each bubble (tennis racquets, smooth balls, Frisbee, cricket bat, running ladder).</li> <li>Equipment must be sterilised after use.</li> <li>Hand washing after use.</li> <li>Children to devise social distancing games using the equipment.</li> <li>Games of catch prohibited</li> <li>Clean cricket bat handles/tennis handles after each player has used.</li> <li>One bowler – only one person holding the ball.</li> <li>Football – non-contact – passing drills.</li> </ol>

Risk of spreading virus due to poor hygiene resulting in indirect transmission of the virus	Pupils and staff	<ol> <li>Invirtu Hand Sanitiser inside of all classrooms</li> <li>Hand Sanitiser order in large quantities</li> <li>Extra soap dispensers and re-fills in each classroom</li> <li>Children handwash or hand gel on entry to school, before break, after break, before lunch, after lunch, leaving school, using the toilet and any time they cough or sneeze</li> <li>Washing hands posters replaced in all washing areas</li> <li>Reminders how to wash hands properly – videos and posters</li> <li>Procedure agreed for children to wash hands so thorough hand washing</li> </ol>
Risk of infection due to lack of cleaning resulting in indirect transmission of the virus	Pupils and staff	<ol> <li>All surfaces, handles, toilets and shared equipment will be cleaned each day using Milton</li> <li>Member of cleaning staff available all day for regular rotation of cleaning duties.</li> <li>PPE will be worn by all cleaning staff</li> <li>Some resources will be rotated and left to de- contaminate for 3 or 4 days after cleaning to reduce the risk of indirect transmission</li> <li>Soft furnishings and soft / cloth toys will be removed from use in classrooms</li> <li>Cleaners to return to work before the school re-opens</li> </ol>
Risk of illness of vulnerable staff and family members through direct and indirect transmission of the virus		<ol> <li>Those who are clinically extremely vulnerable (those who have received a letter from Government or clinician) or living with someone who is clinically extremely vulnerable are to work from home</li> <li>Those who are clinically vulnerable –those strongly advised to social distance in the original guidance are to work at home or work in school adhering to strict 2 metre social distancing from colleagues and children. Those living with those that are clinically vulnerable can attend school and work with children or adults adhering to this and other re-opening risk assessments.</li> </ol>
Risk of transmissio n in school office through direct and indirect transmission of the virus		<ol> <li>Keep left system in place for entry and exit for staff in office.</li> <li>Office set out for social distancing.</li> <li>No hot desking.</li> <li>Sanitiser and wipes available.</li> <li>Windows and door open and use air conditioner for circulation.</li> <li>Keep left system for visitors.</li> <li>No entry to office for visitor.</li> <li>Clear signage for visitors.</li> <li>Phone and email contact advised to reduce footfall.</li> </ol>
